ROMAN ARCHAEOLOGY TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIPS

Applications are invited for Roman Archaeology Travel Scholarships. One of these is the annual Don Boyer Roman Archaeology Travel Scholarship and there will normally be at least one other such scholarship annually. The Scholarships will normally be for a sum of \$2500.00 towards the cost of travel from Australia. In certain circumstances, awardees may also benefit from free coverage under the university's corporate travel insurance policy.

Eligibility:

- (1) All currently enrolled students of the University of Western Australia who will have successfully completed at least one unit in Roman archaeology by the time of travel are eligible to apply.
- (2) Preference may be given to senior students or to those who would not otherwise be able to participate or who are not eligible for support from other university sources.
 - Scholarships are awarded on the basis of the academic merit of the project and financial need.

Purpose:

- (1) The Travel Scholarships are intended to assist current UWA students to participate for a period of at least four weeks in a programme of approved fieldwork in a Roman archaeology project and will normally be used to cover travel costs.
- (2) "Fieldwork" will normally mean excavation or ground survey but applicants with other ideas for obtaining significant practical experience with the material culture of the Roman world are encouraged to present their ideas to the Scholarship Committee. For example a programme of study in one or more museum collections could be supported.
- (3) At the discretion of the Scholarship Committee one or more of the scholarships may be used to enable students to join a Roman Archaeology study tour run by the School of Humanities.

Applications (5 copies) must be submitted to the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences by 31 March or 30 November in any given year and must include:

- A cover sheet stating name, student number, contact details including e-mail address, title of project and dates of intended travel. One page maximum.
- Not more than one typed A4 page describing the intended fieldwork (place, director (s), duration, role) in adequate detail to allow an evaluation of the applicant's planning skills, expectations and ability to meet the other expenses associated with the fieldwork.
- A brief project budget. One page maximum.

Applications may be submitted by e-mail attachment.
